

Welcome to RAINBOWS Camp at Pine Lake Christian Camp!

Come prepared to meet new FRIENDS and to have FUN!

Check-in opens for camp at 5:00 pm on Friday, July 29th or August 5th (depending on which camp you are attending) with dinner to follow at 6:00pm. Arrival time is flexible, but dinner will not be available after 7:00 pm. Please note that camp closes at 3:00 pm (after lunch) on Wednesday, August 5th.

Upon registration, you will find your cabin accommodation and pick up the itinerary for the duration of the camp. The camp is structured to provide a relaxed routine that includes planned and free time. Please note that all sleeping arrangements are camp bunk beds with 6 – 12 beds per room, depending on the cabin. Mattresses are provided. Some cabins have washrooms in the building and others do not. A washhouse, with showers, is on site. Priority for accommodation, with washrooms in the cabin, is given to families with pre-school children. Campers may bring tents or trailers for family accommodation, but remember that a parent must sleep in the same room with their children. No children (under 18 years of age) are to be left unsupervised at night. Please notify Linda if you are planning to bring a tent or trailer.

Our camp fees include cooks, but not cleaning staff. Please expect to maintain your personal space and to **volunteer to share the daily responsibility i.e. take your turn at clearing and washing dishes after meals and tidying the mess hall.** At the end of camp you will be scheduled for a chore that will contribute to leaving the camp the way we found it.

Please note that there are **no laundry facilities on site**, so remember to bring adequate changes of clothing, especially for younger children.

Families are encouraged to participate fully in all camp activities, including the RAINBOWS peer support groups. All campers are asked to not leave the campus, except for emergency reasons. Please notify one of the Camp Deans, should an emergency arise.

Please note that Pine Lake Christian Camp is a **non-smoking campus**.
